Pastor's Report - Phil Staurseth

As always, it is an honor to be your pastor, preacher, and friend.

This last year we were led in worship and ministry by the gospel of Luke. Again and again Luke called us to remember the real-time social, economic, class, and religious barriers that are broken down when the Good News of Jesus and his love gets hold of the Church. And over the summer, with sermon titles like "Making My Space... Your Space," and "Grilling & the Apocalypse," we were reminded how important being together in acts of hospitality really are to the gospel—hospitality is of apocalypitc importance. And so, we ought to be eating with folks—and the more the people with whom we eat are the lost, the last, the least, the stranger, the other... the better. For the work of hospitality is making strangers into allies and allies into friends. Our eating together is not simply an afterthought nor does it make us some sort of religious club... it is what we are called to do.

But it was one Sunday in August in which we were studying Luke 12 that I think best characterizes our work together this year—moving deeper into delight. "..."Don't be afraid, little flock, for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom." We read. It was like God was saying... I provide for you... and I delight in that! I enjoy providing for you. In fact, the pleasure's all mine. And then we explored what it meant to find pleasure in someone else's pleasure, to find delight in someone else's delight.

In September we made a fairly big change in how we do Sunday School. It was not change for change's sake, but rather it was change that came as part of a conversation that focused around a central question—How can we best go about the project of Christian formation at Ravenswood, especially when it comes to our kids? And then we moved forward, and instituted First Word, and First-Word Kids Time, and Sunday School during the sermon time of our Sunday morning gathered worship. We moved carefully, not towards teaching more kids more stuff, but we worked towards being a whole community that finds delight in the Word of God. Thanks be to God. And also, thanks to all the teachers and new volunteers that allowed this all to be tried out.

Together we have worshiped. Many of you have taken part in leading Ravenswood in weekly worship—singing, reading, serving, preaching, preparing, adorning the sanctuary, and more. Thank you.

Church Chair's Report - Gregory Sager

The ongoing witness to the Good News of Jesus Christ through Ravenswood Evangelical Covenant Church continued through its 126th year in 2013 because of the willing hands and hearts of many workers whose efforts and testimonies bear witness to a ministry approved by God. Please take the time to read through this annual report and learn about what those willing hands and hearts have done on behalf of the Body of Christ over this past year. I will only highlight a couple of them myself.

One important work done by the church was the repair of the elevator after many years of it being out of service. These and many other stories that you'll read about in this report are facets of the work that goes on in our church every day to advance the kingdom of God. Please read them and be inspired!

Our attendance, our membership, and our giving remained generally stable in 2013. One thing that did not remain status-quo, however, was our nursery roll! We are in the midst of a baby boom right now at RECC, and we thank God for the blessings that each of these tiny new lives represent within our church family.

Youth Commission Report - Kaleb Nyquist

It has been an honor to continue serving the congregation in the capacity of Student Ministries coordinator. Working with youth is a wild ride, to be sure, but in the end it is a worthwhile adventure and an important ministry of the church.

I will keep my remarks brief and let the notes that follow do most of the talking, although these dry facts and simple numbers cannot adequately testify to what has been happening in the lives of our individual youth both in the congregation and in the neighborhood.

January - May 2013

- Ravenswood Student Ministries organized a weekly youth group on Thursday nights, 6:30 - 8:00pm, following the community meal. Led by student ministries coordinator Kaleb Nyquist, the counseling team included Kristin Johnson, Carl Edgren and Ida Ericsson (now Hiben). Because of an influx of middle school youth from the 5th Quarter program in March, weekly attendance grew from 4 to 11, and then dropped to 6 as the old high school and new middle school youth began to alternate attendance.
- In addition, the 5th Quarter after-school tutoring program took place on Mondays, 3:45 6:00pm. It was led by pastoral intern Chris Wall, with additional tutors Kaleb Nyquist, Mary Anderson, Max Hollingshead, and Gregory Sager. Attendance fluctuated between 5-12 kids throughout the year.
- Once each month, youth were invited to participate in the North Side Youth Collision. Ravenswood successfully hosted the April event, which was a worship service dedicated to the theme of "exploring God's mission." Workshops were led by our own Alice Hague, Krista Bladel, and Kaleb Nyquist, and Sam Vetter contributed to the worship.
- Four youth participated in the Deep Freeze retreat to Covenant Harbor. These youth were Leah Riste, Tatiana Randall, Emily Chendocha, and Jose Rilo. Chaperones were Kaleb Nyquist and Ida Ericsson. In addition, with the sponsorship of RECC, Leeann Bosques attended the One Life retreat with North Park Covenant.

September - December 2013

- Ravenswood Student Ministries restarted the weekly youth group on Thursday nights, 6:30 8:00pm, following the community meal. Led by Kaleb Nyquist, volunteers included Jonatan Saldner, Kristin Coughlin (North Park University Youth Ministry) and occasionally Hannah Saldner. The target age group was 6th 8th grade, although some kids younger and older than the target were accepted on occasion. Attendance was steady at an average of 6 kids, never lower than 5. There were 8 kids for our annual Haunted House excursion to St. Pascals Catacombs.
- Ravenswood Student Ministries brought back the historic "Senior High League" on Sunday nights, 6:30 8:00pm. Led by Kaleb Nyquist, volunteers included Colleen Staurseth and Parenting ProGRESS director Elsa Johnson. The target age group was 9th 12th grade. Our monthly participation with the North Side Youth Collision and many of our "monthly special events" were folded into the Senior High League. Attendance fluctuated wildly, from 0 to 8 on any given night. Throughout the entire year, we were averaging 4 kids. As many as 15 kids in total checked out Senior High League throughout the fall.
- In addition, the 5th Quarter after-school tutoring program saw some changes. It now takes place on Tuesdays, 3:45 6:00pm. It is now led by Kaleb Nyquist, with additional tutors Colleen Staurseth, Mary Anderson, Max Hollingshead, and Liz Ahlem. Colleen and Liz helped to introduce art lessons as part of the student elective choices. Attendance fluctuated from 5-10 throughout the year.
- On Thursday nights Ravenswood Covenant Church hosted the Collision's new Discipleship program for high school youth. Ravenswood youth Tatiana Randall and Leeann Bosques were a part of this first cohort, and helped lead a special middle school Collision, also hosted at Ravenswood Covenant, in early November.
- Kaleb Nyquist also began to teach the Confirmation class in partnership with RECC's Sunday School programming. Gregort Sager was the co-teacher.

Parenting ProGRESS Report - Elsa Johnson

The purpose of Parenting ProGRESS is to provide support to the teen parents whose children attend Ravenswood Community Child Care Center (RC4). We promote growth, responsibility, and education with spiritual support for the Parenting ProGRESS participants. And if we come across a need, we help teen parents who are not connected with RC4 as well. We support these young parents with the goal to see them not only graduate from high school, but also go onto college starting a path for success and overall well-being in their lives. This is made possible by the collaboration of many people (PP advisory board, church community, RC4 community, school communities) and by the excellent childcare that their children receive at RC4.

This year we have supported 12 parents and their families. There are currently 6 children of teen parents attending RC4. One of the RC4 graduates this year was the child of a Parenting ProGRESS mom and this child has continued onto kindergarten. I have met many teens in need of childcare this year and our wait list is large and continues to grow with 10 children currently interested in a spot at RC4. I hope to see more spots available at RC4 this year to provide for some of that need. Additionally, I have been able to connect with many teens in need of donations who have received items from the baby closet although their child does not attend RC4.

Parenting ProGRESS has provided much support to teen parents this year. One way was through monthly Life Skills Workshops led by professionals, community members and church members. These monthly workshops were a great time for the Parenting ProGRESS participants to gain knowledge in relevant topics and gain access to helpful resources in the community. This monthly workshop time, as well as our weekly Mom and Baby Group are times for teen parents to fellowship and gain mutual support from one another. This fall we encouraged teen parents to attend Senior High League at church, connecting our monthly workshop to that time to further encourage attendance. It became apparent that it was not convenient for teen parents to attend. They will still be encouraged to attend Sr. High League, but workshops will be moved to a more convenient after school time after the New Year to encourage more participation in workshops. Teen parents have been greatly provided for through generous donations to the baby closet. We have received donations from church members, RC4 parents, and other community members. The donations received are much appreciated by the families who receive them. We celebrated Christmas at our annual Christmas party where each teen parent and their child received Christmas gifts donated by church members, RC4 parents, RC4 staff, and friends of the church. Thank you to all who have donated to Parenting ProGRESS this year!

A huge support for Parenting ProGRESS moms is our mentor program. Each Parenting ProGRESS mom is paired with a mentor. One new mentor has been trained and matched this year and others continue their mentor relationship from last year. Mentors come from the church as well as the RC4 community. They build one-on-one intentional relationships with the PP moms and provide positive support to help them set and reach their goals. I am always working to connect with other programs in the community in any way beneficial to our program and its participants. Lastly, there are various other ways that I support PP parents through one-on-one support ranging from assistance with paperwork, school support, scholarship help, employment assistance, housing help, accompanying to appointments and advocating for their own needs as well as their children's. I find that these one-on-one moments are what I enjoy the most, because when you are present in someone's life in this special way, you will find that relationships deepen, people feel valued and God tends to make his presence known right there in the midst of you.

We celebrated with two teen parents in June as they graduated from high school. One graduated from Amundsen High School and the other from Lake View High School. Both have continued on to college and we continue to support them since their children still attend RC4.

A special thank-you to Audrey Hodgkinson, Judy Edstrom, Carol Koeller, and Barbara Nordlund who serve on the Parenting ProGRESS advisory board. And thank you to Kristine Brandel who is always thinking of new or continuing ways to support Parenting ProGRESS.

It is a pleasure for me to serve as director of this important ministry of RCC. I look forward to the coming year to see what is in store for our ministry in 2014!
